




- evidence of their employment, contract, property ownership, lease or agistment arrangements.

As an approved class of person, farmers and agribusiness workers:

- a. must travel directly to and from the relevant farm or premises; and
- b. must only exit their mode of transport to access rest stop facilities, refuelling, and activities directly related to their agribusiness activity or to meet required regulation activities such as workplace health and safety or fatigue management; and
- c. may stay at overnight accommodation when necessary in order to fulfil fatigue management requirements; and
- d. who are Queensland residents must remain isolated, to the extent reasonably practicable, from the general public at the agribusiness or farm in New South Wales until the person returns to Queensland; or
- e. who are New South Wales residents must remain isolated, to the extent reasonably practicable, from the general public at the agribusiness or farm in Queensland until the person departs Queensland or for 14 days, whichever period is shorter. They must only remain in Queensland for the time necessary to perform the essential agribusiness or farming activities.

This exemption has been approved based on the Public Health Directions and COVID-19 hotspot declarations in place at the time of approval. It is each farmer's and agribusiness worker's responsibility to review the Public Health Directions and hotspot declarations at the time of their entry to Queensland to determine if they are subject to any amended requirements or obligations.
