SPECIES AND PLAGUE THRIPS IN BLUEBERRIES**

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows the Permit Holder and any person stipulated below to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Products to be used:

NUFARM METHOMYL 225 INSECTICIDE (APVMA No. 47336)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 225 g/L METHOMYL as the only active constituent.

RESTRAINT:

DO NOT use in covered or protected situations such as glasshouses, greenhouses or plastic tunnels.

DO NOT spray plants in flower while bees are foraging. Ensure beehives are removed from the area to be treated and from adjacent paddocks.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
Blueberries	Red-Shouldered Leaf Beetle (<i>Monolepta australis</i>) Helicoverpa spp. Plague Thrips (<i>Thrips imaginis</i>)	100 mL / 100 L water

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply as a coarse spray with low pressure ground equipment.
- Red-Shouldered Leaf Beetle – apply according to pest incidence.
- Helicoverpa spp. – apply when infestation reaches an economically damaging level.
- Plague thrips – apply when numerous on flowers.
- Keep unprotected persons and animals out of operational areas during treatment and while there is a danger of drift. Avoid contact with spray residues.

Re-entry:

Do not allow entry into treated areas for at least 24 hours after treatment. When prior entry is necessary, wear cotton overalls buttoned to the neck and wrist (or equivalent clothing), a washable hat and elbow-length PVC gloves. Clothing must be laundered after each day's use.

Withholding Period:

Harvest: Do not harvest for 5 days after application.

Jurisdiction:

QLD, TAS, SA, VIC, ACT, and NT only.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994*, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.
