## CONDITIONS OF USE

### Products to be used:

APPARENT SULFUR 800 WG FUNGICIDE AND MITICIDE (APVMA No. 66641)  
PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 800 g/kg SULPHUR PRESENT AS WETTABLE SULPHUR as the only active constituent.

### RESTRAINTS:

DO NOT apply within 3 weeks of an oil spray or mix with oils or formulation containing mineral oil.

DO NOT apply in hot weather.

### Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
Blackberries	Broad mite ( <i>Polyphagotarsonemus latus</i> ) Two-Spotted Mite ( <i>Tetranychus urticae</i> ) Bean Spider Mite ( <i>Tetranychus ludeni</i> ) Red Berry Mite ( <i>Acalitus essigi</i> )	400 – 500 g / 100 L

### Critical Use Comments:

- Apply as a foliar spray in a spray volume of 1000 L/ha using airblast sprayer or equivalent calibrated vertical sprayer application equipment. Complete coverage of all foliage is essential.
- Application is to be made on new growing canes during the vegetative growth stage.
- DO NOT make more than ten applications per crop with a minimum retreatment interval of 7-14 days between consecutive applications.
- Avoid spray contact with flowers.
- Follow all label recommendations and restraints.

### Withholding Period:

Harvest: Not required when used as directed.

### Jurisdiction:

All States and Territories.

### Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994*, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.

*To Avoid Crop Damage*

The sensitivity of the crop to be treated under this permit has not been fully evaluated. It is advisable to only treat a small area to ascertain the reaction before treating the whole crop.

*Export of treated produce*

Treated crop commodities destined for export may require extra time being allowed between application and harvest, to be accepted in some export markets. If treated produce is to be exported, due account should be taken of the residue definition and residue limits/import tolerances of importing countries; any residues must not exceed those requirements of the importing country.
