**PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF A REGISTERED AGVET CHEMICAL
PRODUCT FOR SUPPRESSION OF BLUEBERRY RUST IN BLUEBERRIES**

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows the Permit Holder and any person stipulated below to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Products to be used:

NUFARM INTERVENE FUNGICIDE (APVMA No. 90033)

Containing: 113 g/kg POLYOXIN D ZINC SALT as the only active constituent.

RESTRAINTS:

DO NOT apply by aircraft.

DO NOT apply if heavy rains or storms are forecast within 24 hours.

DO NOT irrigate to the point of runoff from the treatment area for at least 24 hours after application.

SPRAY DRIFT RESTRAINTS:

Specific definitions for terms used in this section be found at avma.gov.au/spraydrift.

DO NOT allow bystanders to come into contact with the spray cloud.

DO NOT apply in a manner that may cause an unacceptable impact to native vegetation, agricultural crops, landscaped gardens and aquaculture production, or cause contamination of plant or livestock commodities, outside the application site from spray drift. Wherever possible, correctly use application equipment designed to reduce spray drift and apply when the wind direction is away from these sensitive areas.

DO NOT apply unless the wind speed is between three and 20 kilometres per hour at the application site during the time of application.

DO NOT apply if there are hazardous surface temperature inversion conditions present at the application site during the time of application. Surface temperature inversion conditions exist most evenings one to two hours before sunset and persist until one to two hours after sunrise.

DO NOT apply by a vertical sprayer unless the following requirements are met:

- spray is not directed above the target canopy.
- the outside of the sprayer is turned off when turning at the end of rows and when spraying the outer row on each side of the application site.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Disease	Rate
Blueberry (Field and protected cropping systems)	Blueberry rust (<i>Thekopsora minima</i>) Suppression only	22 g or 40 g/100L OR 220 g or 400 g/ha

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply as a protective treatment in line with climatic conditions that favour infection.
- Apply by airblast sprayer or equivalent.
- Apply as a foliar spray just prior to the point of runoff.
- DO NOT apply more than 6 applications per season.
- Apply with a minimum re-treatment interval of 7 days.
- Follow all Safety directions, First-aid instructions and Re-entry requirements listed on the product label.
- Follow all Protection statements listed on the product label.

Withholding Period:

Not required when used as directed.

Jurisdiction:

All States and Territories, except VIC.

Note: Victoria is not included in this permit, as their Control-of-Use legislation means a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in that State.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.
